Notification

Whereas the draft of the Karnataka Education Department Services (Department of Public Instruction) (Recruitment) (Amendment) Rules, 2006, was published as required by sub-section (2) of section 3 of the Karnataka State Civil Services Act 1978 (Karnataka Act 14 of 1990), in Notification No. Ed 51 DGO 2005 Dated:25th July 2006 in Part-IV-A of the Karnataka Gazette (Extra-ordinary) dated 25th July 2006 inviting objections and suggestions from persons likely to be affected thereby within fifteen days from the date of publication in the Extra-ordinary Gazette.

And whereas, the said Gazette was made available to public on 26.7.2006.

And whereas, the objections and suggestions received in this behalf have been considered by the State Government.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 3 read with section 8 of the Karnataka State civil Services Act, 1978 (Karnataka Act 14 of 1990), the Government of Karnataka hereby makes the following rules namely:-

RULES

1. **Title and Commencement:-** (1) These rules may be called the Karnataka Education Department Services (Department of Public Instructions) (Recruitment) (Amendment) Rules, 2006.

(2) They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. **Amendment of Schedule:-**In the Schedule to the Karnataka Education Department Services (Department of Public Instructions) (Recruitment) Rules, 1967, for the category of post of "Headmasters / Head Mistresses of Government Higher Secondary/ Multipurpose Boys' High Schools, Head Masters / Head Mistresses of Government Boys'/ Girls' High Schools", at serial number 18 and the entries relating thereto, the following shall be substituted namely:-

High Schools; Headmasters/ Headmistresses of Government Boys / Girls High Schools.</p>	<p>(i) Twenty five percent by direct recruitment on the basis of marks obtained in a competitive examination conducted by the Karnataka Public Service Commission. The provisions of Rules 4 to 15 and the Schedules to the Karnataka Recruitment of Gazetted Probationers (Appointment by Competitive Examinations) Rules, 1997, in so far as they apply to Group-B posts specified in Schedule-II thereof shall, subject to the provisions of these rules, mutatis mutandis apply for the conduct of the competitive examinations with the following modifications, namely:-</p> <p>In Schedule-II, (1) in section-1, (i) under the heading, "A" Preliminary Examinations", in the entries relating to Paper-II, for the words " one subject to be selected from the optional subject" the word "Education" shall be substituted.;</p> <p>(ii) under the heading "B" Main Examination", in the entries relating to paper-III & IV, the following shall be substituted, namely:-</p> <p>Paper-III General Studies 300 Marks</p> <p>Paper-IV Education 300 Marks</p> <p>(2) in section II, " Syllabi for the examination", (i) Under the heading, " Part-A. Preliminary Examination Compulsory Subjects", under the sub-heading " (II) Paper-II Optional" and the entries there under, the following items shall be substituted, namely:- "Education"</p> <p>(ii) under the heading, " Part-B, Main Examination", for the sub-heading "Paper-IV General Studies" and entries there under, the following shall be substituted, namely:- " Paper-IV Education" Part-I Educational Administration-100marks</p>	<p>For Direct Recruitment:- (1) Must be holder of a degree of a University established by law in India or equivalent qualification; and (2) Must be holder of a degree in Education of a University established by law in India or equivalent qualification.</p> <p>Age:- Must have attained the age of eighteen years and not attained the age of, (a) Forty years in the case of persons belonging to any of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Category-1. of other Back ward classes; (b) thirty eight years in the case of persons belonging to other Backward Classes; and (c) thirty five years in the case of any other person on the last date fixed for receipt of the applications or on such other date, as may be specified by the Appointing Authority.</p>

3. **Repeal and savings:-** (1) The Karnataka Education Department Services (Department of Public Instructions) (Recruitment) Rules 1967, are hereby repealed to that extent:

Provided that such repeal shall not affect:

- (i) The previous operation of the said rules or anything done or any action taken there under:
- (ii) Any right, privilege or obligation acquired, accrued or incurred under the said rules.

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in these rules, action already initiated if any for disciplinary proceedings or recruitment under the repealed rules before the commencement of these rules shall be continued and completed under the repealed rules, as if, they are not repealed.
